(Initial speaker registration will be from 5:30 – 6:15 p.m. When all registered speakers have been heard and no further speakers wish to comment the hearing will close.)
- Purpose:** As required by New York Education Law, the purpose of this hearing is for SUNY to hear public comments **about locating Brooklyn Success Academy Charter School 3¹ in part of Building K293, located at 284 Baltic Street, Brooklyn, New York 11201,** which is owned by the New York City Department of Education (DOE).

SUNY is holding its hearing at the same time as the DOE is conducting a hearing on this school building, although SUNY is acting pursuant to a separate law and needs to make a separate decision regarding the charter school using the space.
