(Initial speaker registration will be from 5:30 p.m. - 6:15 p.m. When all registered speakers have been heard and no further speakers wish to comment the hearing will close.)
- Purpose:** As required by New York Education Law, the purpose of this hearing is for SUNY to hear public comments **about locating the high school grades of Bedford Stuyvesant Collegiate Charter School and Brownsville Collegiate Charter School¹ in part of Building K458, located at 832 Marcy Avenue, Brooklyn, New York 11216**, which is owned by the New York City Department of Education.

SUNY is holding its hearing at the same time as the DOE is conducting a hearing on this school building, although SUNY is acting pursuant to a separate law and needs to make a separate decision regarding the charter school using the space.

¹ The board of trustees of Bedford Stuyvesant Collegiate Charter School and Brownsville Collegiate Charter School submitted a request to the SUNY Trustees to add high school grades 9-12, with the high school students to be served in a jointly co-located, single high school program. This revision is subject to approval by the SUNY Trustees.
