SUBJECT: Notice of Action on Charter Renewal Applications

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Charter Schools Committee of the State University of New York Board of Trustees (the "SUNY Trustees") acting on behalf of the SUNY Trustees, approved the applications for charter renewal of the following schools on March 6, 2015.

- **Albany Leadership Charter High School for Girls**, located at 19 Hackett Blvd., Albany, NY in the City School District of Albany, seeks a three year renewal of its charter commencing August 1, 2015. According to the renewal application, the school would serve 365 female students in grades 9-12.
- **KIPP Tech Valley Charter School**, located at 1 Dudley Heights, Albany, NY in the City School District of Albany, seeks a five year renewal of its charter to commence on August 1, 2015. According to the renewal application, the school would grow to serve 700 students in grades K-8.

SUNY Charter Schools Institute will be forwarding proposed renewal charters for the above schools to the New York State Board of Regents in the near future for approval or other action consistent with the New York Charter Schools Act of 1998 (as amended).

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the Charter Schools Committee, acting on behalf of the SUNY Trustees, denied the applications for charter renewal of the following schools.

- **Brighter Choice Charter Middle School for Boys**, located at 116 North Lake Ave, Albany, NY in the City School District of Albany, seeks a three year renewal of its charter. According to the renewal application, the school would provide instruction to approximately 235 students in grades 5-8.
- **Brighter Choice Charter Middle School for Girls**, located at 395 Elk St, Albany, NY in the City School District of Albany, a three year renewal of its charter. According to the renewal application, the school would provide instruction to approximately 238 students in grades 5-8.

The denials mean the schools will cease operations at the end of the current school year and then move toward dissolution.
