This Notice is to inform you that the State University of New York Board of Trustees (the "SUNY Trustees"), in its capacity as a charter authorizer, has received an application to revise the charter(s) of the charter school(s) listed below. Further, the SUNY Trustees, or their designees, the SUNY Charter Schools Committee or SUNY Charter Schools Institute (the "Institute"), anticipate consideration of this request as soon June 11, 2020. A description of the proposed action follows:

- **Ascend Charter Schools**, an education corporation with the authority to operate more than one school, has requested the following revisions:
 - **East Brooklyn Ascend Charter School**, located at 260 Shepherd Avenue, Brooklyn, New York 11208 in Community School District ("CSD") 19, currently authorized to serve 54 students in grade K for the 2019-20 school year growing to 378 students in grades K-4 by the 2023-24 school year, requests an enrollment decrease to serve 24 students in grade K for the 2019-20 school year growing to serve 351 students in grades K-4 by the 2023-24 school year, the final year of the current charter term.
 - **East Flatbush Ascend Charter School**, located at 870 Albany Avenue, Brooklyn, New York 11203 in CSD 18, currently authorized to serve 108 students in grades K-1 for the 2019-20 school year growing to serve 324 students in grades K-5 by the 2023-24 school year, requests an enrollment decrease to serve 79 students in grades K-1 for the 2019-20 school year growing to serve 297 students in grades K-5 by the 2023-24 school year, the final year of the current charter term.

- **Lefferts Gardens Ascend Charter School**, located at 870 Albany Avenue, Brooklyn, New York 11203 in CSD 18, currently authorized to serve 162 students in grades K-1 for the 2019-20 school year growing to serve 486 students in grades K-5 by the 2023-24 school year, requests an enrollment decrease to serve 48 students in grades K-1 for the 2019-20 school year growing to serve 405 students in grades K-5 by the 2023-24 school year, the final year of the current charter term.
